- Promote legislation making it illegal to include a confidentiality clause in most production contracts or in a contract for the purchase of livestock
- Provide meaningful antitrust resources and enforcement. We have gone 25 years without it, to the detriment of Montana's consumers and small businesses.
- Support moving enforcement of the Packers and Stockyards Act to the US Department of Justice, where it belongs.
