

Steve Bullock

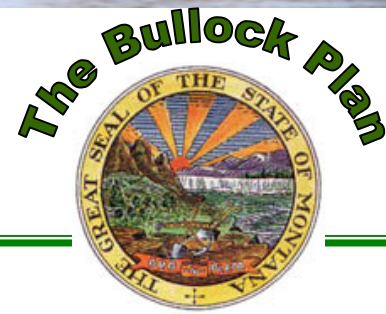


As the only candidate who has served in the Attorney General's office, Steve Bullock has already proven his stripes on the important issue of access to public lands.
